Sewing the Pine Tree border.

When sewing the Pine tree blocks together, the object is to alternate the blocks all around the quilt.

1> Sew 2 sets of vertical trees each containing 3 trees.

1 set is made up of Pine tree: 1,2,1 and

2nd set is Pine tree: 2,1,2



Then sew one set to each side of the Santa Block.

2> Sew 2 sets of horizontal trees each containing 4 trees.

each set is made up of Pine trees: 1,2,1,2



Then sew one set to the top of the Santa Block and one to the bottom, so that the blocks alternate around the Santa Block as discussed above.

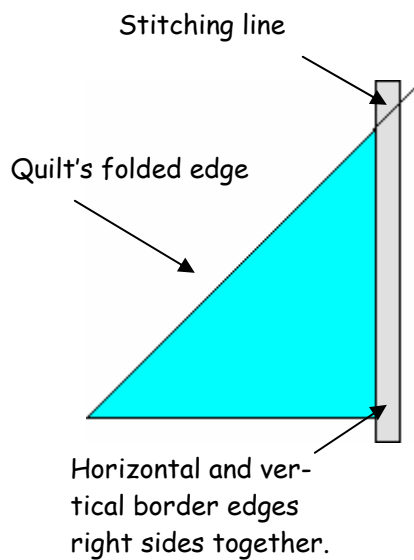

### Mitered Border

Cut 2 Horizontal border pieces 37" X 2.5".

Cut 2 Vertical border pieces 44" X 2.5"



The border fabric amounts shown are more than the quilt is wide or long on purpose. This excess is necessary in order to create the mitered border.

Center the horizontal strips on the top and bottom of the quilt and pin with the right sides together. Stitch each border to the quilt beginning and ending 1/4" away from the edge, backstitching at the 1/4" point. Do not cut off the excess fabric. Press the seams to the quilt top.

Center the vertical strips to each side of the quilt and pin with the right sides together. Stitch each border to the quilt beginning and ending 1/4" away from the edge, backstitching at the 1/4" point. Do not cut off the excess fabric. Press the seams to the quilt top.

Fold quilt on diagonal, right sides together. Align top border edge to the side border edge as shown in the image at the right. Pin the border seams at the 1/4" point. Stitch from the previous stitching to the edge of the border at a 45 degree angle. Repeat for all 4 corners.

### Outer Border



Sew two sets outer borders with 8 vertical border units each. Sew to the vertical edges of the quilt.



Sew two sets outer borders with 6 horizontal units and two cornerstone units each, with one cornerstone unit on each end. Stitch border to the horizontal edges of the quilt. The cornerstone unit will be cover the vertical border. See the image.
